## Dinah O-Brien – Domestic Violence Awareness

National Domestic Violence Awareness Month (DVAM), observed in October, is a time to recognize victims and raise awareness about the devastating impact of domestic violence.

Domestic violence is a pattern of abusive behavior in any relationship used by one partner to gain or maintain power and control over another partner. This kind of abuse affects everyone – men, women, and children of all races, religions, and cultures – without prejudice.

To help prevent domestic violence, it is important to recognize the warning signs. Signs often begin subtly and worsen over time. While not all-inclusive, the following list may indicate potential signs of domestic violence.

- **Isolation** – Permission is needed before making plans or speaking to friends and family members. Victims may be forced to quit their jobs or drop out of school.
- **Low Self-Esteem** – Feeling deserving of the abuser’s violence, accepting fault for, and making excuses for their partner’s behavior.
- **Unexplained Injuries** – Bruises, cuts, scrapes, or even broken bones that are blamed on clumsiness or are in multiple stages of healing.
- **Depression or Anxiety** – Persistent feelings of hopelessness, fear of angering their partner, and fear of repercussions for seeking help.

If you are concerned that someone you care about is in an abusive relationship, the [National Domestic Violence Hotline](#) recommends the following approach:

- Express your concerns to your loved one in a gentle and non-judgmental way.
- Encourage participation in activities outside of the relationship with friends and family.
- Encourage outreach to people who can provide help and guidance, such as the phone number for the [National Domestic Violence Hotline](#), **800-799-SAFE (7233)**.
- Continue to show your support regardless of the decisions made by your loved one.

## Aileen Baker – Health & Wellness

### Sew Kind:

Instead of the usual article I submit to the newsletter I am going to attach an excerpt from an email I received from Bev Berryman, Community Engagement Director at Crittenton / Services for Children and Families. This will give you an idea of what they provide for many children and families. This is the organization that Sew Kind has been supporting for a long time and every year we provide them with Christmas Stockings that the ladies have sewn. We provide around 400 stockings for them. If anyone has further questions regarding this organization, give me a call, text or email me.

Crittenton Services in Fullerton is a 501©3 nonprofit organization originally founded in 1966 to help unwed mothers. Since that time, Crittenton has expanded to serve hundreds of children, youth, and families in a multitude of programs. Serving 5 counties, we provide specialized programs for those children who are victims of commercial sex trafficking or in need of substance abuse intervention. We provide a temporary home to refugee children, who have fled violence and poverty or been rescued from child trafficking. We offer foster care/adoption and have continued to expand services for young adults (up to age 24) that have moved from their foster families to independent living (THP). Our families in crisis may be homeless, in shelters, or living in motels. Their situations span every form of abuse, mental or physical illnesses, substance abuse, and violence. Our outreach counselors bring services to these extremely poor children, helping them to stay with a parent whenever possible. As a nonprofit, we rely on community support to help make holiday wishes come true for our children and families. We are a lifeline to these local children whose families can afford little or nothing for the holidays. The angel tree program allows you an opportunity to connect in a meaningful way with a specific child, teen, young adult and family. Every person that we serve has been assisted by his or her therapist or social worker to create a Santa wish list. We work to find donors to make those wishes come true. There are wishes in all price ranges from stocking stuffers to sneakers; all gifts are under \$50.

### GFWC National Day of Service

The GFWC (General Federation of Women’s Clubs) is an international women’s organization dedicated to community improvement by enhancing the lives of others through volunteer service. As a member of the Yorba Linda Woman’s Club, you are also a member of the GFWC, the CFWC (California Federation of Women’s Clubs), and the Orange District.

As Federation Sisters, we participated in the GFWC’s Inaugural National Day of Service (NDS) on September 30<sup>th</sup>. GFWC’s vision for the NDS was a day in which all of GFWC would come together in service to highlight an area of need, take action to address it, and raise public awareness about its importance.



The GFWC reported the engagement of over 880 Clubs, 24 Districts, 29 State Federations, 5 National Clubs, 1 Region (Middle Atlantic Region), and 1 International Affiliate Club (Aruba). All demonstrated a remarkable commitment to making a positive impact on the targeted and serious issue of *Food Insecurity*.

Twelve YLWC members joined pantry volunteers at the Yorba Linda Food for Families distribution center, following their rescue of food/goods from local grocers. We processed personal care items and food, and bagged produce from 9:00-10:30 a.m. Tables and crates were set out for our assembly lines. Some of us separated packages to allow for better storage space, while others checked produce for spoilage and bagged the best of the product. The pantry is open for distribution one day a week, and the rest of the week pantry volunteers spend time rescuing, preparing, checking dates and products, stocking, and keeping statistics of inventory.

Our participation in the GFWC National Day of Service was 90 minutes toward achieving a positive change through community service, truly celebrating GFWC’s motto of *Living the Volunteer Spirit!*
